- * Females can begin their heat period and get pregnant as early as 6 months of age
- * Heat periods can last a month: bleeding 7 – 10 days then Fertile 7 – 10 days more
- * Time between heat periods 5 12 months
- * Pregnancy lasts 63 days
- * Males can impregnate as early as 6 8 months of age
- * Puppies can start solid food at 4 weeks can be weaned by 6 weeks
- * Heartworm Is a preventable, but serious and potentially fatal, parasite that primarily infects dogs, cats and ferrets.
- * 90% of Lyme disease have occurred in the North Central & North East states of the USA

Feline Facts

- * Females start heat and can get pregnant as early as 4 months old
- * Felines are induced ovulators will go in and out of heat at will until pregnant
- * Pregnancy lasts 63 days
- * Males can impregnate as early as 6 months
- * Kittens can start solid food at 4 weeks and can be weaned by 6 weeks
