It’s flea and tick season!

What does this mean for you and your pets? In order to protect your pets from flea infestation and annoying tick bites, they need to be on a monthly preventative. We recommend using Frontline Plus. Why microchipping your pet is beneficial

Dog and cat microchipping is a simple procedure. A veterinarian or a technician simply injects a microchip, about the size of a grain of rice, beneath the surface of your pet's skin between the shoulder blades. This process is similar to a routine injection (vaccines), and it only takes a few seconds. No anesthesia is required. A microchip is a form of permanent ID. This microchip is programmed with a unique number that is registered to you, the owner. This number is read by a special microchip scanner, which most shelters and veterinary clinics are supplied with. If your pet gets lost and is taken to a shelter or a veterinarian, they will scan for a microchip and read its unique number, and this number will be used to identify the pet and contact you and reunite you with your pet.

Facts about Microchipping

- Pet microchips are NOT tracking devices (GPS). They only carry a unique ID number.
- Even if your pet wears a collar with identification, there is always that chance that the collar may become lost. A microchip is permanent identification.
- A microchip will normally last the lifetime of your pet.
- 30-60% of lost pets are euthanized because they cannot be properly identified.
- A microchip also serves as a permanent source of ownership, in case of theft of your pet.
